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Out of Home full year results for 2024

The Out of Home (OOH) industry today announced full year net media revenue results including the category breakdowns for 2024.

The industry saw a total increase of 8.07 per cent on net media revenue in 2024.

As previously reported, net media revenue for 2024 increased to \$1,301.8 million, up from \$1,193.7 million* for 2023, across the following categories:

Digital Out of Home (DOOH) revenue accounts for 75.2 per cent of total net media revenue year-to-date, an increase over the recorded 73.4 per cent* for the same period last year.

Editor's note on how figures are calculated:

The Outdoor Media Association (OMA) estimates that it represents close to 100 per cent per cent of the Out of Home (OOH) industry in Australia. Figures provided in this media release are net figures (exclusive of commission, production, and installation). Figures represent advertiser campaigns posted in each quarter. Figures also include all direct sales which are estimated at 10 per cent of total bookings.

About the OMA

The OMA is the peak industry body which represents most of Australia's Outdoor Media Owners and Suppliers, and some Asset Owners.

The OMA operates nationally and prior to July 2005 traded as the Outdoor Advertising Association of Australia (OAAA). It was first incorporated in 1939.

The OMA's charter is to serve its members by promoting the OOH industry and developing constructive relations with its primary stakeholders.

Its core functions are Marketing and Research (including audience measurement), Government Relations and Regulatory Affairs, Media Relations, and Member Services.

The OMA is governed by a Board of Directors which is elected by the membership. Members of the OMA adhere to a Code of Ethics and abide by the regulatory frameworks in which they operate.
